BMDCSC will not be responsible for any damage caused by a foster dog in the foster home;

It is the foster home's responsibility to confine the dog indoors until an assessment can be made on behavior; you agree to provide a healthy, stable, loving, and safe environment for the rescue dog, preferably until the dog is placed in a permanent home. While there is no established timeframe that a dog may be in foster care and BMDCSC cannot predict when the right placement fit may occur, the foster home should at a minimum not accept a foster dog for at least 3 weeks prior to any planned vacation.

BMDCSC will evaluate the foster dog at any time, with notice; if it is determined the dog needs to be moved for the benefit of the dog, BMDCSC will transport the dog to a new foster home.

The foster home understands that this is not an adoption and this rescue dog is the property of the BMDCSC. If the foster home wishes to adopt the dog, the foster home must complete an application and go through the adoption process.
